

Through three decades of intellectual and artistic research, Coco Fusco's work has engaged with and interrogated the complexities of race, colonialism, exile, gender, identity, and the shaping of possible new societies. A profoundly interdisciplinary artist and writer, Fusco's significant contributions spanperformance, video, exhibition practice, archival research, and formal writings. Her practice frequently reflects on conceptual and embodied existences within socio-political frameworks, plumbing the depths of latent aspects of representation and their effects on cultural memory.

Coco Fusco lives and works in New York. She is a recipient of a 2021 American Academy of Arts and Letters Art Award, a 2021 Latinx Artist Fellowship, a 2021 Anonymous Was a Woman award, a 2013 Guggenheim Fellowship, a 2013

Absolut Art Writing Award, and a 2003 Herp Albert Award, among others. Fusco was the feature of the retrospective Tomorrow, I Will Become an Island (2023) at the KW Institute of Contemporary Art in Berlin, which will travel to the MACBA, Barcelona in 2025. The artist's performances and videos have been presented at the 56th Venice Biennale, three Whitney Biennials (2022, 2008, and 1993), and several other international exhibitions. Her works are in the permanent collections of the Museum of Modern Art, The Walker Art Center, The Art Institute of Chicago, The Whitney Museum, the Centre Pompidou, and the Museum of Contemporary Art of Barcelona.

The exhibition aims to highlight Coco Fusco's rigorous exploration into the erasure and metamorphosis of cultural identities, particularly in societies shaped by the aftereffects of colonialism. By different mediums such as videos, photos, and performance, Fusco crafts a multifaceted narrative language. This language acts as a tool, enabling the artist to dissect and critically engage with the socio-political dynamics inherent in post-colonial societies. At the intersection of visual art, performance, and cultural politics, Fusco examines race, identity, and the new shape of societies.







With her multidisciplinary practice, Fusco explores the ways that intercultural dynamics affect the construction of the self and ideas about cultural otherness. Her work is informed by multicultural and postcolonial discourses as well as feminist and psychoanalytic theories. Her investigation of intercultural dynamics has led her to develop art projects about ethnographic displays, animal psychology, sex tourism in the Caribbean, labor conditions in free trade zones, suppressed colonial records of Indigenous struggles, and the

military interrogation techniques used in the war on terror. Her more recent work focuses on the relationship between poetry and revolutionary politics in Cuba.


The exhibition is loosely structured along these various interconnected themes. As such, Tomorrow, I Will Become an Island shows the breadth of Fusco's artistic practice that is highly relevant considering current political and cultural debates in Germany and beyond.




